Tuesday, August 21 — Author: Margo Nash Author, of the book "The Politics of Murder". This is the riveting true crime story that author and former trial lawyer Nash has presented as a miscarriage of justice. It involves the arrest of 15-year old Eddie O'Brien for the gruesome stabbing and murder of his best friend's mother. Despite the fact that the defendant

had no history of violence or anti-social behavior and no blood on his person or behavior and the police couldn't determine a motive, he was arrested. The sensational nature of this case, dubbed "the altar boy Murder case " soon became politicized with politicians calling for harsher laws in juvenile justice. This is also a compelling case as it takes place in Somerville, MA. Author Nash was also appointed as guardian ad litem for Eddie O'Brien, a designated adult with whom Eddie could discuss his legal representation. Her thorough research into this case, and advocacy of this juvenile defendant led the way for the famous Innocence Project to take on the O'Brien case. Don't miss this program. 

May 15: Baby Shower and Tea — What a wonderful




